

Introduction

The greater part of the Norwegian coast is protected by a chain of islands, rocks, and skerries known as the 'skjaergård'. This stretches from Lindesnes (The Naze) eastwards to Oslo and - far more extensively - from Stavanger for a thousand miles up to North Cape with only a few intervals exposing the mainland coast. The channels that wind their way behind this screen are known on the west coast as the 'Indreleia' - inner sheltered leads.

The coast and islands of the south are wooded with a gentle skyline. Going north up the west coast the scenery becomes starker and wilder; the islands lose their trees and greenery and, particularly off-shore, become bare and denuded of any vegetation. The great mass of islands, thousands upon thousands in number, furnish an inexhaustible choice of sheltered anchorages and safe mooring places. These are known as vik (creek or bay) or naturhamn (natural harbour).

In a lifetime of cruising in Norwegian waters the yachtsman could only use a small fraction of the scores of anchorages identified on each of the 116 1:50,000 charts mapping the coast. Amongst this unlimited choice there are a majority with no sign (or minimal presence) of human artefacts, utterly peaceful, absolutely clean, unpolluted, quiet, just nature.

The main difference between the west coast of Norway and the southern area is the existence in the former of the major fjords with their majestic scenery; also, as one sails further north, of mountains near the coast whose sides run down into the sea and are snowcapped the year round.


