### Approach

The river Crouch and approaches are well marked with lit channel markers as far as Baltic Wharf, Wallasea Island. The Visitors' Pontoon at North Fambridge is a further 5nm upriver and has two single green flashing navigation lights (Fl(3)G.4.5s). Approaching from seaward, pass through Burnham on the north bank and the commercial Baltic Wharf on the south side. The river is deep and wide up to North Fambridge, although be aware that Bridgemarsh Island, a very large area of flooded marshland on the north (starboard) side of the main river channel, can be partially submerged on very high tides.

As you approach North Fambridge, you will see mid-river moorings ahead of you with the 120m Visitors' Pontoon on the starboard side.

### Facilities

The Yacht Station is situated in a tranquil location surrounded by salt marsh with a variety of birds and wild life. Showers, toilets and waste disposal are located near the car park close to the road. The Ferry Boat Inn is a traditional village pub adjacent to the entrance to the Yacht Station road entrance. Fambridge Yacht Haven Marina is located about half a mile further upstream with fuel, gas and a small chandlery and convenience store.
