Simon Rowell is a Meteorologist and a RYA Yachtmaster Ocean Examiner. Crossing Biscay is a serious endeavour and getting a detailed picture of the weather to be expected on passage is essential. Simon will explain the modern approach to weather forecasting and show how to make the best use of the data that is freely available to help you plan a safe voyage.

John Burbeck Orca Interactions .The presentation will provide the latest knowledge and tips.

John sold his Moody 43 Eclipse early in 2022 having spent the previous 6 years almost full time cruising. He sailed back from the Med through Orca Alley in 2021 without incident, although a yacht a few hours behind was not so lucky. Since the beginning of 2022 he has led a RATS based CA team trying to help develop advice to help yacht crews avoid interactions with the orca, and to reduce the damage if one occurs. The presentation will provide the latest knowledge and tips.

Jim Everson - Crossing Biscay - The good, the bad and the lumpy

Jim and his wife Angela cruise around NW Europe on their Jeanneau Sun Odyssey 439. In 2023 they headed down to Northern Spain again from their winter base in Chatham Kent. The presentation covers their planning and decision making process for crossing Biscay, some observations not found in the pilot guide, a few highlights of their trip, and one or two lowlights!'

Nick Sexton - Across Biscay to explore the Rias Baixas

Nick and his wife Deborah own a Nicholson 476, berthed in southern Brittany on the Vilaine River. During the summer of 2022 they visited the eastern regions of northern Spain. Following that successful trip they returned again in 2024 to explore the north western coasts of Spain, including the delightful ports and cities of Galicia, along with the Atlantic facing Ria Baixas, with their unspoilt, remote beaches and sheltered anchorages.
