Start in Plymouth and cruise to Salcombe, or start in Yarmouth and cruise to Poole and then Cherbourg (France). Then both flotillas cruise onwards to meet in St Peter Port (Guernsey), before cruising on to Carteret (France) where, after some further shore attractions, the rally ends.

You can then cruise home or onwards, with your new rally friends or alone.

There will be a rally WhatsApp group for liaison between members during, before and after the rally.

## The West Country Flotilla

### Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> June - Meet in Plymouth

The rally will start at Queen Anne's Battery (QAB), in Plymouth - the Ocean City. QAB has all the usual marina facilities with chandlers, sailmakers and marine engineers on site. QAB is a short walk from the historic Barbican area with many restaurants and attractions.

Pontoon welcome drinks and then a meal at Waypoint Bistro, a relaxed restaurant, located within the marina complex with a great view over the yachts in the marina to the breakwater beyond.



### Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June - Day in Plymouth

Guided walk along the coast from Mount Edgcumbe to Kingsand. We will take the ferry from Mayflower Steps to Mount Edgcumbe via the former victualling depot of the Navy at Royal William Yard. Following a coffee halt we will walk part of the SW footpath to the village of Kingsand and a lunch stop for a pint and a pasty before taking the ferry from Cawsands to the Barbican and the chance for shopping at some bigger supermarkets before returning to QAB.

No dinner booked so eat on board or try one of the many Barbican restaurants.

#### Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> June - Cruise in Company to Salcombe (~20 miles)

Salcombe is a popular holiday destination with a picturesque harbour, set in a dramatic coastline and surrounded by unspoilt countryside. The town surrounding the harbour consists of narrow streets and steep alleyways with a great variety of shops, restaurants and cafes to choose from - and a small but very interesting maritime museum. We'll be moored on a pontoon further into the harbour in the area known as 'The Bag'. A water taxi runs regularly to and from the



Whitestrand quay if you don't fancy a long dinghy ride to the town.

Drinks follow by Pot Luck Supper on the pontoon and a briefing for the channel crossing.

#### Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June - Day in Salcombe

Group walk, via the ferry to East Portlemouth, around the headland to Gara Rock including views of the infamous Salcombe Bar. Returning on the ferry and a chance to visit the shops in Salcombe, the maritime museum and the RNLI Lifeboats (unless they're called out!)

No dinner booked so eat on board or go ashore to restaurant.

### Saturday 17th June - Cruise in Company to St Peter Port (~74 miles)

This town port has a picturesque sea front and marina. There is an inner marina with a gate as well as shoreconnected pontoons (and for deeper draft vessels) with full tidal access in the outer area.

Berth in Victoria Marina.

## The Solent Flotilla

## Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> June - Meet at Yarmouth

This is an attractive harbour and town in the western Solent, convenient for setting off around the Needles and to Cherbourg.

Pontoon welcome drinks and then a meal (barbecue) at Yarmouth Sailing Club.

## Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June - Cruise in Company to Poole (~23 miles)

Poole harbour claims to be the largest natural harbour in the world and has much happening of a nautical and other kinds.

Berth at Poole Quay Boat Haven.

No dinner booked so eat on board or at a local restaurant.

## Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> June - Day in Poole

Visit to the RNLI College to see how their volunteer lifesaving volunteer crew and lifeguards are trained with a 90 minute behind the scenes tour. Then have two course hot buffet lunch at the College overlooking Poole Harbour.

There is an interesting historical self-guided walk of the town you might wish to do to occupy your afternoon.

No dinner booked so eat on board or at a local restaurant.

## Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June - Cruise in Company to Cherbourg (~67 miles)

The city has many restaurants and shops all located quite close to the marina. Amongst the town's attractions are: the excellent maritime museum which includes an aquarium and a French nuclear submarine; the Cherbourg & Liberation Museum in a fort on the rock above the town; the Emmanuel Liais Park and much more.

No dinner booked so eat on board or at a local restaurant.

## Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> June - Day in Cherbourg

Option to hire the marina's electric bikes for the day to go further afield along the cycle routes westwards maybe including a ride out along the massive harbour wall.

Purchase your bottle of wine for this evening's "Pontoon Wine Tasting Challenge".

No dinner booked so eat on board or at a local restaurant.

## Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June - Day in Cherbourg

Option to hire the marina's electric bikes for the day to go further afield along the cycle routes westwards maybe including a ride out along the massive harbour wall.

Group dinner at L'Equipage restaurant (Yacht Club restaurant).

## Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> June - Cruise in Company to St Peter Port (~50 miles)

This lively town has a picturesque sea front and marina as well as a number of tourist attractions. There is an inner marina with a gate as well as shore-connected pontoons with full tidal access in the outer area.











## The Combined Flotilla

### Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> June - Day in St Peter Port

Guided group "Potato Peel Pie" walk around St Peter Port.

Pontoon drinks party.

Three course dinner (with selections for each course made in advance) at Guernsey Yacht Club

#### Monday 19<sup>th</sup> June - Day in St Peter Port

"Safari supper" where each boat prepares one course of a meal (not gourmet) for a few extra crew. Crews move from boat to boat for each course in an organised manner to meet and mix.

#### Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> - Cruise in Company to Carteret (~30 miles)

A drying entrance to a gated marina for this pretty resort town with numerous restaurants, a good sandy beach and some attractive walks.

No dinner booked so eat onboard or at local restaurants.

#### Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> - Day in Carteret

A group walk to the lighthouse and ruined church on the beach.

No dinner booked so eat onboard or at one of the restaurants.

#### Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> - Day in Carteret

It is market day in town though not the big summer market yet. So get supplies for your barbecue this evening at a market stalls, at the delicatessen in Carteret or go to Barneville for more larger shops and a supermarket.

DIY barbecue (bring and cook own food) at Barneville Carteret Yacht Club.

#### Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June - End of Rally

Say farewell to all your new cruising friends, and maybe sail onwards or back home with some of them.

Further passage and other details will be provided prior to the event to those who have booked.

### Terms And Conditions

- 1. The skipper shall be a fully paid up member of the CA.
- 2. Should the rally have to be cancelled before it starts then all monies will be returned to participants. The organisers retain the right to vary the programme if necessary.
- 3. A vessel may withdraw from the rally but will still be liable for costs unless their place is filled by another vessel or suppliers agree to reduce their charge, which the organisers will use all reasonable efforts to achieve.
- 4. Vessels attending the events are to be covered by adequate third party and public liability insurance; minimum £2,000,000 for any one accident.
- 5. The Event Organisers and Organising Body shall not be in any way liable for any loss, damage, death or personal injury howsoever caused to the owner, skipper, his/her crew or other persons on a boat, as a result of their taking part in the Meet, Rally or Cruise-in-Company. Moreover, every skipper/owner warrants the suitability of his/her yacht/boat for the Meet, Rally or Cruise-in-Company and that his/her boat is insured for taking part in the Meet, Rally or Cruise-in-Company;
- 6. When on a Meet, Rally or Cruise-in-Company with the CA the safety of any yacht/boat and her entire management including insurance shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/skipper who must ensure that the yacht/boat is fully found, thoroughly seaworthy and manned by a crew of sufficient number and experience who are physically fit to face bad weather. The owner/skipper must be satisfied as to the soundness of the hull, spars, rigging, sails and all other gear. He/she must ensure that all safety equipment is properly maintained, stowed and in-date and that the crew know where it is kept and how it is to be used.

The vessel is insured and I have Third Party and Public Liability insurance cover of at least £2,000,000 for any one accident. My insured cruising range covers the area relevant to this event. I am aware that the Cruising Association and the Rally organisers accept no responsibility for the safety of my vessel, or its crew. The decision to sail and all handling of the vessel and its tender are the responsibility of the skipper who should take his/her decisions knowing the abilities of his/her vessel and of his/her crew. I confirm that I have read and agree to the General Conditions that apply to the CA Sections' Rallies/ Meets and Cruises.
